A message from the CEOs

As we reflect on 2024, we are filled with pride and gratitude for our achievements and strides as an organization. Our team of thirty dedicated staff members boasts a combined 370 years of experience, showcasing long-term commitment to GROW South Dakota. This year has been one of growth, innovation, and resilience for our organization.

Growth

In 2024, we saw a record demand for affordable first-mortgage housing loans and business loans. Our organization now manages over 1,480 active loans, totaling more than \$50.65M. We've also experienced a growth in investments from funders, with awards totaling more than \$6.4M this year. A notable award came from USDA Rural Development for the Intermediary Relending Program (IRP), a revolving loan fund for business lending.

Growth occurred in other areas too. Our agency-owned apartment complex, Pheasant Valley Courtyard, was awarded funding from the Inflation Reduction Act to conduct a building retrofit, focusing on utility efficiency and climate resilience needs. Other programs, such as HUD Housing Counseling, Weatherization Assistance, and Digital Literacy, also saw an increase in funding.

Innovation

Our history of innovation in the housing space has taken many forms. For the past decade, a predominant activity has been providing down payment assistance to homebuyers. The program has been incredibly successful, offering over \$12.8M to more than 1,700 homebuyers. Though our down payment funds are nearing full commitment, our experienced staff will continue to support homebuyers in South Dakota with first mortgage loans, homebuyer education, and personalized one-on-one coaching to equip homeowners for success.

Resilience

Throughout the year, we worked diligently with local and national partners. Proposed federal compliance changes for Community Development Financial Institutions would restrict our ability to lend in a large geographic space of South Dakota's non-metro area. Our organization has proposed alternatives and shared this information with our partners, exemplifying our commitment to supporting rural communities.

Looking Ahead

As we move into 2025, we know that things will look different than they have in the past. However, we are excited about the opportunities ahead and are confident in our ability to navigate the future with the same determination and vision that have brought us success so far.

A Look at Housing

Making the dream of homeownership possible through mortgage loans, down payment assistance, and education.

Mortgage Lending

Supports individuals and families in making their dream of homeownership come true by financing home purchases.

- 13 loans for a total of \$1,876,692
 - 9 first-time homeowners

Down Payment Assistance (DPA)

Provides potential homeowners with down payment assistance on their home purchase.

- 43 loans for a total of \$266,000
- 40 were first-time homeowners
- DPA program funds are nearly exhausted

Homebuyer Education

Provides information to potential homeowners on purchasing a home, securing financing, understanding credit, and much more.

• 107 homebuyers completed training

Financial Coaching

Offers coaching for pre-purchase, rental, and financial management for homeowners. Coaching includes creating an action plan, developing a budget, and setting follow up goals personalized for each individual.

• 35 individuals completed this program

Housing Development

Two homes were developed and are for sale in Sisseton, SD. Each home has a full basement, an attached two-car garage, and 1,680 sq. ft. of living space on the main floor.

Homeowner Improvements

Improving the lives of families through major and minor home repairs to owner-occupied single-family homes.

Home Improvement Program

Provides repairs to owner-occupied, constructed homes on a permanent foundation for low-to-moderate-income households.

Weatherization Program

Assists individuals by implementing energy-efficient measures in their homes. Eligibility is determined by income guidelines.

Furnace Program

Repairs or replaces furnaces for eligible homeowners if the furnace is not operating properly.

2024 Program Totals

Over 170 households and 400 individuals, received more than \$1.4M worth of home improvement and energy efficiency measures.







Edward knew that his home needed significant repairs but wasn't sure how to make them possible. He had heard good things about GROW South Dakota, so he decided to reach out and see if their programs would be a good fit for his situation.

With assistance from GROW South Dakota's Home Improvement Program, Edward was able to receive a new furnace, central air, water heater, patio door, shower, basement wall, carpet, and an accessibility ramp.

When asked how this has improved his life, Edward said, "I can now take a shower, and I have easier access in and out of the house with the new ramp. The mold in my basement is now gone. This program has helped to better my life and has helped to keep me living in my home."

Economic Development

GROW South Dakota is a statewide lender, supporting entrepreneurs through loans for real estate, equipment, inventory, and working capital. We also offer training and technical assistance to new and existing business owners.

Business Lending

Loans are provided to finance new and existing borrowers throughout the state. In 2024, we financed the following loans:

- 62 loans totaling over \$8.5M in funding to 55 businesses statewide.
- The average loan amount was over \$137,000.

Business Training

Trainings are provided throughout the year, including: Quickbooks, Cybersecurity, Funding for Startup, Basics of Google Ads, Initiate, and What Lenders Look for in Financials, plus many more. Over that last year:

• 280 clients received over 560 hours of training.

The Small Business Development Center (SBDC)

Offers no cost, confidential business management consulting services to support potential and existing businesses in SD. Throughout the 2024 year:

- 185 clients received consulting services
- \$7.7 million in capital was obtained
- 22 jobs were created/retained
- Four businesses were purchased
- Five new businesses created



A New Lease on Life

After 28 years in the business, Anthony Schwan, owner of Anthony Jewelers, fell ill and had to sell his business to cover medical expenses. After some time, he was able to move back to Aberdeen and restart his business. With the help of GROW South Dakota, he managed to get back on his feet after being closed for two and a half years. Anthony utilized GROW South Dakota's business loan services and the digital literacy platform, Initiate. This platform gave him a renewed sense of independence in today's digital age through classes like "Building the Value of Your Business" and "Accessing Your Online Presence."

Anthony said, "I have a new lease on life! With GROW South Dakota's help, I now have a new 1,500-square-foot store in downtown Aberdeen!" He added, "The services GROW South Dakota provides are instrumental for all small businesses and restarting a business."

HISTORY

For more than 50 years, GROW South Dakota's housing, community, and economic development programs and services have been serving the needs of local individuals, families, business owners, and entire communities in order to sustain our rural quality of life.

The evolution of GROW South Dakota as a statewide nonprofit was started in 1966 through the creation of the Northeast South Dakota Community Action Program (NESDCAP) servicing three counties. The community action program approach was a result of President Lyndon B. Johnson's 1964 legislation to battle the war on poverty. Funded by federal, state and local resources, the agency opened its doors in Sisseton, South Dakota to provide a means to assist low-income individuals and families become more self-reliant and improve daily living. NESDCAP's first expansion in 1974 added service to seven counties and seven more counties were added in 2001 bringing the expanded service area to 17 counties in northeast South Dakota.

The Northeast South Dakota Economic Corporation (NESDEC) was established in 1978 through NESDCAP's vision to stimulate small business ownership, business development, and job creation in low-income and rural communities of a 10-county service area. As inquiries for these innovative NESDEC business development programs and services increased from adjacent counties, the service area was expanded to serve 22 counties in 1987. In 2024, NESDEC was expanded to offer services statewide.

Visible economic impacts in the region and the continual success of expanding agency services and the revolving loan fund created a demand for statewide services. As a result, Grow South Dakota was established in 2007 to service all 66 counties in South Dakota.

In 2012, NESDCAP, NESDEC, and Grow South Dakota unified their three core initiatives of housing, community, and economic development into the now recognized brand of GROW South Dakota. Although NESDCAP, NESDEC and Grow South Dakota continue to operate as separate legal entities with varying service areas, the same great care is provided to the residents and communities we serve.
